The residents of Mark Twain Neighborhood need to be proactive in reporting all illegal behavior witnessed to authorities. Statistics are kept on calls. Have the address where the criminal behavior is occurring, as well as the business name if it is at a local business. You may request a phone call from the responding officer. Also, ask for the case number to be sent to your email. Call both 505-242-COPS and Narcotics for drug dealers and drug usage.

If we work together consistently, our neighborhood's problems have a better chance of being addressed and resolved. If you're having a recurring issue, you may request extra patrols by calling the Southeast Area Substation.

State Fair District - Redevelopment

A proposal by the state to move the State Fair / Expo NM from its current location is still being discussed. A company from outside NM, Stantec, has been contracted to evaluate and recommend development of the Expo property. This would likely include mixed housing, entertainment venues, and other features. A board has been formed to help direct development options.

The first meeting of the State Fair District Board of Directors, created by state legislative session, was held at the Alice Hoppes African American Pavilion July 3, 2025. The 7-member Board consists of Governor Lujan Grisham, State Senator Stewart, State Rep. Anyanonu, County Commissioner Barboa, ABQ Mayor Keller, District 6 City Councilor Rogers and Governor-appointed "community representative" Dr. Pete Belletto, who is also President of the District 6 Coalition of Neighborhood Associations. Many of the Mark Twain NA Board and many other concerned neighbors attended this meeting.

Presentations were made by advisors on the District's finances, the background and implications of SB481, its revenue sources derived from 75% of all gross receipts and gaming taxes generated within the District, and its bonding capacity which is authorized up to \$500 million.

There was an introductory presentation made by Stantec, the consulting firm which has been awarded (after RFP) an \$844,433 contract to develop the Master Plan for the district. Information about them can be found at:

https://www.stantec.com/en/services/community-development. Their work will include outreach to and engagement with the community, especially the adjacent neighborhoods like Mark Twain. The Governor was emphatic about the importance to the project of community input and that there is no commitment to move the Fair at this stage.

The Dept. of Transportation has been tasked with purchase of privately owned land on the NE corner of Central and San Pedro.

State Fair Manager, Dan Mourning, emphasized historical buildings that should be preserved within the Master Plan, including the Indian Arts Pavilion and the horse stables built by the WPA during the 1930's.

An Executive Committee coordinating all aspects of the project process consists of Former ABQ Mayor Martin Chavez, Governor's Chief of

Staff Don Schlegel, and Economic Development Strategist Alex Greenberg.

The Board's meeting schedule will be the first Thursday of every month and the next meeting is scheduled for 10AM on August 7th.

Revitalize San Pedro Partnership Updates July 2025 Who is RSPP?

Revitalize San Pedro Partnership is a 501(c)(3) effective January 1, 2024. We are a coalition of four adjoining neighborhoods and business leaders along the San Pedro corridor who

have been working together for over a decade. Our focus is to preserve and improve the San Pedro corridor from Central north all the way to I-40. We are an accelerator project of New Mexico Main Street and are on track for full accreditation from Main Street America.

Recent Accomplishments: A Request from Councilor Fiebelkorn resulted in approved capital funds from the State Legislature of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) to acquire rights of way for and to plan, design, construct and equip improvements to San Pedro drive NE between Cagua place NE and Lomas boulevard NE, to including lighting and landscaping for our Revitalize San Pedro Partnership. We greatly appreciate the support of Councilor Fiebelkorn and look forward to seeing proposed designs soon! Winrock Town Center - Project Update for the Mark Twain Neighborhood Association

We're pleased to share a brief update on recent progress and upcoming activity at Winrock.

The **Winrock Park** has now been open for one year and continues to serve as a central gathering space for the community. Building on that success, we have programmed **over 70 community events** for the spring and summer seasons. These include:

- A highly successful Friday Night Concert Series
- Wellness Wednesdays featuring a farmers market, yoga on the lawn, food trucks, and live entertainment
- Children's programming on Tuesday mornings and during Saturday markets

The **comedy club** has also gained traction and is consistently drawing strong attendance. We encourage anyone who enjoys live comedy to attend a show.

The **Regal Theater** has completed a full renovation. All auditoriums now feature **reclining** seats, and the theater has introduced the **state's only 4DX experience**, an immersive technology that goes beyond 3D with motion and environmental effects.

A new **bar** located in the building at the center of the park will open soon, adding to the onsite beverage offerings.

On the west side of the property, a new building has been completed and will soon house **Chicken Salad Chick** along with additional tenants.

Construction is underway on our much-anticipated **food hall**, which will be located directly across from the Regal Theater on the ground floor of the **New Mexico Orthopedics** building.

We're also pleased to announce that **Ethan Allen** is joining the project and will be located adjacent to **DSW**.

The new **office building**, located directly across from the stage, has begun occupancy with office tenants.

Additionally, the pond continues to thrive with a healthy ecosystem of fish, turtles, frogs, and ducks — providing both educational and recreational value for visitors.

To maintain and enhance the park's role in the community, we've launched a **Friends of the Park** program. This volunteer initiative provides opportunities to contribute in areas such as landscaping, gardening, pond education, and support for community events.


